Leader Prep Section

- Prepare by reading through the questions and scripture passage so that you can select a **few** questions that are best suited to your group.
- Try to work through at least one question from each of the sections Hook, Book, Look, Took in order to move from observation to application.
- When possible spend time in prayer for each member of your group.

Paul's background, power of Jesus to change lives, power of our story

Hook - Ice breaker type questions to help make the transition into the study time.

- What are some things that stood out to you from Sunday's sermon?
- What does it mean to share your story? Why is personal history important?

Background / Reading Galatians 1:6-24 and Acts 9:1-30

Book - These questions are designed to get you into the text itself.

- What is the "different" gospel Paul mentions? And who are the people related to it?
- What is the point Paul is trying to make in vs.11-20?

Look - These questions will take you on a deeper look at what the passage means for us today.

- Why does Paul care about the Galatians?
- Do you think Paul is responding to some accusations / misconceptions about him? What do you think those might have been, based on what he says here?
- What if the New Testament did not include Paul's letters? What would be missing from the message of Jesus?
- What does Paul's story say about the power of one person's obedience?

Took - These questions are focused on applying the big idea from the text to our lives.

- Do you need some kind of radical miraculous change in your own life that only Jesus can give?
- Is there someone in your life who you struggle to believe God can truly change?
- Where do you feel called to a radical obedience to Jesus? What might be gained if you trust Jesus? What might be lost if you don't?
