Songs and Psalms Week 3 - June 21st - Psalm 25:9

Read: Psalm 25:9

9 He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them His way. - Psalm 25:9

What does being 'humble' mean?

- Humble means "modest; without an excess of pride."
- Genuine gratitude and lack of arrogance, a modest view of one's self.

How can we practice being humble? (you can ask them to think of some

different ways to practice humility)

- Routinely confess your sins to God.
- Receive correction and feedback from others (when your parents show you a better way to clean your room!).
- Choose to serve others (bringing a can of food to the foodbank or doing one of your siblings chores for them).

Why do you think God wants us to be humble?

- It's not easy to confess your sins and ask for forgiveness if you are not being humble.
- We do not take feedback or listen to ideas well if we are not humble.
- If we were being truly humble, we would go out and serve others and put others first. But if we have pride and not humility, we will want to serve only ourselves.

Activity: Thankful for Thankless Jobs.

There are many people who perform thankless jobs that make your child's life easier. This could be a mailman, teacher, janitor, librarian or someone who organizes a community event. Start by helping your child identify these selfless people. Next, provide materials for your child to create thank you cards to give to these people. Helping your child see how they benefit from others humility, can help them become more humble too.

Preschool: Have your child draw a picture for someone they want to thank that serves them or your family in some way.
