Sponsorship is vital because a sponsor helps support Tracy so that she can attend a Life Center (which is similar to Sunday School) and receive essential basic needs. It also helps to provide for her education, which would allow her to accomplish her dreams of graduating from school.

This year Tracy experienced many changes in her life similar to you. Schools closed down, families lost work, and there were many unknowns. Thankfully, because Tracy is a part of Childcare Worldwide's program, she received essential items to keep her safe and protect her from Covid. Some of these things included masks and soap to keep her clean and healthy. Tracy also received bible lessons to help her remember that God loves her and cares for her.
