Hook - Getting to know one another

- How is everyone doing this week? Add other questions to get to know one another, especially ones related to the topic in the sermon.
- Describe a time or place where you found yourself in physical darkness, and needing light. What stands out about that moment?
- As an entry point into today's passage, consider watching this Bible Project video about John 1:1-18 as a small group (6:41 long) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XgslCbXOOIE

Book - Scripture

- Read the scripture passages and discuss to understand what the text is saying:
- Read John 1:1-18
- What is stated about the Word in this passage?
 - What other names or titles are used for the Word?
 - What is stated about the relationship between the Word and God?
- What is said about the humans that interact with the Word? What are they like?
- The words "In the beginning" refer to Genesis 1 (Consider reading Genesis 1:1-5). What connections are there between Genesis 1 and John 1?
- In John 1: 14, the words "made his dwelling" (NIV) refer to the idea of tent or tabernacle. Thinking back to our Leviticus series this fall what connections come to mind between the tabernacle and the Word in John 1?

Look - Connections to our world today

- This section focuses on implications about **what this text means** about what's wrong in the world, about trusting God, about who God is, etc.

- What is revealed about the nature and character of Jesus in this passage? About the nature and character of God?
- What in our lived experience can make it challenging to see the vision of this passage in our everyday lives?
- If you were explaining this passage to someone and they asked why John 1:1-18 should matter for them, how would you respond?

Took - Personal Application

- This application focuses on **how God is calling us to respond**. This could be personally, as a family, small group, or church. It could be something to believe, to meditate on, to say or do this week.
- For you personally, what did you find to be encouraging or good news in this passage?
 - How might you revisit and meditate on that truth in the week ahead?
- In what places of your life do you long for Jesus to bring light and life?
 - How can we pray for those spaces together?
