Read Along with the Sermon Series

- **Sept 28** - Mark 1:1 - 13 (Prologue)

- **Mar 8** – Mark 12:38–13:37 (Judgment)
- **Mar 15** – Mark 14:1–31 (Passover and New Covenant)
- **Mar 22** – Mark 14:32–15:20 (Jesus on Trial)
- **Mar 29** – Mark 15:21–41 (The Cross)
- **Apr 5** – Mark 15:42–16:8 (Resurrection)

Whole-Book Reading (Once per Month) -

With 16 chapters in Mark, reading about half a chapter a day will complete the book in a month.

- **October** – Read Mark 1–16 (note first impressions).
- **November** – Read Mark 1–16 - (pay attention to Jesus' Mighty Words and Mighty Deeds).
- **December** - Break
- **January** – Read Mark 1–16 (focus on what Following Jesus means).
- **February** – Break
- **March** – Read Mark 1–16 (focus on the confrontation in Jerusalem)

You are invited to read Mark along with the Sunday teachings, read through it once per month during the series, or if you do both, you will have read through Mark 5x by Easter!
